Guidelines for the Showcase

- All entries should have an introducer and a speaker.
- The Speaker can deliver any speech of their choosing
 - O From the programme
 - O Of their own
 - From the curriculum
- The Speaker can choose any title for their speech
- The Speaker should deliver the whole speech in one video recording.
- The Speaker should be in the camera frame when they are speaking.
- The speech should not exceed two minutes.
- The introducer should be in the camera frame, the whole time they are speaking.
- All recordings must be audible.





Submitting your entry

There are 4 steps to submitting your storytelling entry:

Step 1

You can enter as many of your class as you wish. There is no cost. Please fill in the consent form. Please fill in the students names and the school name as you would like it to appear on our certificates and honours board.

Step 2

Ensure that you have a good clear video recording of both the introducer and the speaker, where both pupils are fully visible and audible when speaking. The speaker should deliver the whole speech straight through (please see the guidelines of the speech competition)

Step 3

Upload the video to our secure server. You will be given the link and instructions as soon as we receive your request to enter. **Note the video recordings will only be viewed by the observing judges, after which, any videos without full permissions to remain, will be deleted from the server. (See GDPR)

Please state the name of the speaker, the name of the school AND the location of the school, clearly in the information box when submitting the video entry.

Step 4

You will be notified of the results of the judges observations after the showcase.

All pupils who participate in the programme will receive a certificate of participation.
